Use this guide for conversations with your physician. Below is a list of questions your doctor may ask you if you think you may have Atrial Fibrillation (AFib) or have been diagnosed with AFib.



Do you experience any of the following symptoms?

- ☐ Irregular heartbeat or palpitations
- 🗋 Chest discomfort
- ☐ Fatigue
- Shortness of breath
- 🗌 Weakness
- Dizziness

Have you seen any specialists for your symptoms?

How long have you been experiencing the symptoms above? How often do they occur?

What is the severity of these symptoms?

Do they keep getting worse?

Are any of your symptoms keeping you from your regular daily activities?

Has your quality of life been impacted? How?

What does your family history look like?

- Do you have a family history of heart disease?
- Do you have a family history of AFib?

Have you had a heart attack?

Have you ever been diagnosed with the following?

- Heart abnormality from birth
- Damage to the heart structure from a heart attack
- Heart valve problem

What medications are you currently taking?

Do you currently take heart rhythm control medication or heart rate control medication?

How long have you been on those?
